- To deliver triage and relevant recovery prescription to cricketers across Essex Emerging Player Programme, U18 & U15 County Age Groups.
- To work collaboratively with the wider multi-disciplinary team support player performance and associated development goal.
- To lead and champion local and ECB led clinical/performance/research projects.
- To work collaboratively with the Lead Physiotherapist to ensure high standards of medical governance.
- To work collaboratively with ECB and other relevant staff to co-manage players across pathways.
- To actively participate in the ECB's Science and Medicine Review process
- Communicate non-confidential headline availability and fitness status information with relevant coaches, delivery staff, DOC, Academy Director, Lead SSSM, Head of Athlete Development
- Effectively manage internal and external medical record-keeping standards, ensuring they
  maintained at a satisfactory level as per HCPC guidelines and are entered on to the ECB's
  Injury Management Database.
